Minutes 5607.	<p>The minutes of the meeting held on 22nd June 2020 are accepted as a true record and are authorised to be signed by the Chairman</p> <p>Proposed Councillor Crawford Seconded Councillor Sykes</p>	
Harley Cricket Club 5608.	<p>Councillor Hunton commented that the proposal to move the wicket could impact the play area and that the area must be protected and remain in its current location. He further commented that this is a community problem and that the cricket club and residents should have been brought together to resolve the issue. Councillor Bradley reminded the meeting that the two sides had been brought together on more than one occasion and that no agreement could be reached.</p> <p>5609. Members raised concerns that a social media campaign initiated by members of HCC was creating divisions within the community of Harley and that councillors have been subjected to harassment and abuse. The main concern of the community appears to be the rumour that the current playing field is to be used for building purposes once HCC has vacated the pitch. This is not true reflection of the situation and members are to draft a statement to be placed in the notice boards in an attempt to stop the false rumours.</p> <p>5610. A senior member of HCC has advised a councillor that the team no longer wishes to move the wicket, but that it should remain in its current position.</p> <p>5611. It is proposed that as the wicket is to remain in the current location, HCC should deliver a boundary risk assessment to the parish council within one calendar month so the matter can be progressed and the divisive actions brought to a close.</p> <p>Proposed Councillor Bradley Seconded Councillor McNamara</p> <p>Resolved By unanimous vote, HCC are to be asked to provide a boundary risk assessment to the parish council within one month.</p>	JH
Harley Mission Planning Application 5612.	<p>Councillors Shaw and Sykes declared a personal interest in the following item and took no part in the discussion or vote.</p> <p>The Harley Mission Trust has applied for planning permission to create a car park on land opposite the Mission Rooms, one objection from a Harley resident has been lodged with RMBC so far. Members discussed the application and agreed that a car parking area would improve the parking issues along Harley Road, the car park would only be opened for the use of visitors to the room and would be kept locked at all other times.</p> <p>5613. The issue of visitors crossing a busy road was raised by councillor Dickerson, Overall members thought the car park would be a positive thing for improving road safety</p> <p>5614. It was proposed that no objections be raised to the application.</p> <p>Proposed Councillor Crawford Seconded Councillor Hunton</p> <p>Resolved By majority vote (1 abstention MRD) that no objections be raised to the planning application</p>

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<p>Matters Arising 5616.</p>	<p>The VAS sign at Barrowfield is to be moved to a more suitable location by RMBC. The hedges at the bottom of the Church footpath are to be cut back by the Estate and slow signs are to be painted on the road to make the exit from the footpath safer.</p> <p>5617. Public footpaths 6 and 7 appear to be blocked by growing crops, the Estate to be asked to look into the matter. Councillor Hunton also asked if RMBC could provide better signage along the paths.</p> <p>5618. It was noted that an organised football match or practice has taken place on Wentworth playing field. No permission has been given to do this and the situation is to be monitored.</p> <p>5619. RMBC is to be asked to tidy the overgrown grass verges along the B6090 between Wentworth and Harley.</p> <p>5620. The gold chippings on Church Drive are blocking the drains, the Estate is to be asked to look into the matter.</p> <p>5621. The peacocks that have been causing a nuisance in Harley have been relocated to Chatsworth</p> <p>5622. Harley residents have complained about the racks and crates of produce outside the village shop.</p> <p>5623. The Harley bungalows still need repainting, RMBC to be advised.</p> <p>5624. Harley JFC have raised £2200 for Sheffield Children's Hospital</p> <p>5625. The environmental issue at Cover Close has been resolved</p> <p>5626. The telephone wires are getting caught up in trees on Wentworth playing field, Councillor Stevenson to look at the matter further</p> <p>5627.
