

	<p>5149. The Dearne Valley parkway is a magnet for large numbers of "boy racers" who congregate in large numbers and appear to hold street races, the police have issued an open letter asking people not to do this. Work has been carried out in the shopping complex and gates and barriers erected to try and stop the anti social behaviour, but this seems to have moved the problems elsewhere. Councillor Roche reported that there have been problems in the Wentworth area and that RMBC are considering traffic calming measures in some areas. He also reported that funds for carriageway resurfacing will be minimal this year. The police are looking at ways to stop the problems of boy racers, but seem to have a dispute with Barnsley police as to who is responsible, it also appears that the parkway does not meet the criteria for speed cameras.</p> <p>5150. Councillor Roche reported that if all the proposals are voted through RMBC will have a balanced budget for the coming financial year.</p> <p>5151. Councillor Roche noted that the latest round of minor road resurfacing is being planned, and if any suggestions could be put forward. The B6090, Lodge Drive, Cricket View Road and Kirby Lane were proposed by members.</p> <p>5152. Councillor Roche noted that a small amount of funding is available in each ward for capital items, grants of up to a £1000 are available. Application forms are available from RMBC.</p> <p>5153. It was noted that the fly tipping camera has been stolen, RMBC are hoping to replace it, but there have been issues with invasion of privacy claims.</p> <p>5154. RMBC were asked to clarify the position on littering from a vehicle, it now seems that anyone can report an incident and that the respective characters of the accused and accuser will determine which party will be believed in a report where there is no photographic evidence.</p> <p>5155. A resident has requested a dog bin be provided in the arboretum, Councillor Hunton asked if one could be provided from the capital grants funding. Councillor Roche noted that issue would be the emptying of the bin. Councillor Roche is to look into the provision of further litter bins.</p> <p>5156. Councillor Hunton asked if RMBC could cleanse the war memorial site before the November remembrance service.</p>	DR DR
<p>Police Matters</p>	<p>5157. Inspector Bakewell reported that an extra sergeant has been employed and the team now consists of 2 sergeants, 5 police officers and 11 PCSOs. There has been an increased effort to reduce burglaries and robberies in the area. The police will be supporting the Wentworth remembrance service and it is expected to be a very well attended event.</p> <p>5158. Councillor Shaw noted that in a recent survey in Harley most people wanted to see an increase in visible police patrols, however a regular meeting with the PCSOs is proving popular.</p> <p>Councillor Roche left the meeting at 7.32pm</p> <p>5159. Members raised concerns about cars parking on pavements and causing an obstruction, particularly along Main Street and Occupation Road. Inspector Bakewell commented that this is a widespread problem and in one incident a ticket had been issued to a motorist, who took the matter to appeal and won the appeal.</p> <p>5160. The arrangements for the remembrance service are progressing well and a new union flag has been ordered. A request has been received from an RMBC lead organisation, Wentworth & Elsecar Together, to place large poppies, similar in design to the flowers created for the Tour De Yorkshire, around Wentworth war memorial. Members discussed the matter and agreed that the poppies could not be placed in the war memorial area as they would detract from what is a solemn service, but there are no objections to the group putting the poppies along the fence between the Rockingham Arms and the war memorial, the fencing around the playing field of the trees along Church Drive.
