<b>Minutes 6719.</b>	The minutes of the meeting held on 21st October 2024 are accepted as a true record and are authorised to be signed by the Chairman.  Proposed Councillor Shaw Seconded Councillor Sykes		
<b>Matters Raised By Parishioners 6720.</b>	Harley residents have complained again about parking issues along Cricket View Road. A response has been issued to the previous complainant regarding the viability of parking in the playing field. A similar statement is to be published on the local WhatsApp page		JK
6721.	Complaints have been received from Harley residents that the Coach Road is being used by vehicles as a shortcut to the school for parents to collect children, the matter has been reported to the Estate. The parish council has previously raised the matter with the Estate, but will do so again.		JH
6722.	Complaints have been received from a Harley resident about double parking around the junction of Occupation Road and Lodge Drive. The resident has been advised to contact RMBC.		
6723.	A complaint has been received from a Wentworth resident about parking on the double yellow lines along Clayfield Lane. It was noted that it is a rare occurrence and the double yellow lines have significantly improved access problems on the Lane.		
<b>RMBC Matters 6724.</b>	A request has been sent to RMBC to sweep the leaves from Clayfield Lane as they cover the double yellow lines. This will be the second sweeping of leaves this season.		
6725.	RMBC are planning a winter warmer event in December.		
<b>Matters Arising From The Minutes 6726.</b>	Regarding minute 6682, a grant has been received towards the cost of a new notice board for Harley. The notice board is expected to be completed early in the new year.		
6727.	Regarding minute 6690, the carriageway drains have been repaired near to the Barrowfield properties.		
6728.	Regarding minute 6693, the new road signage is progressing through the relevant departments in RMBC.		
6729.	Regarding minute 6695, RMBC have no budget for cleansing lamp posts , the matter will not be pursued further.		
6730.	Regarding Minute 6704, It was noted that no one attended the latest parish councillor surgery held in Wentworth.		

	<p>6731. Regarding minute 6709, RMBC has responded to the request for carriageway repairs along the B6090 around the Alms houses. It states that regular carriageway inspections are undertaken on all its highways and that the road surface in question does not currently meet the criteria for repairs.</p> <p>6732. Regarding minute 6711, the JFC signed agreement has not yet been received.</p> <p>6733. Regarding minute 6713, a new clerk has been appointed and a new laptop is to be issued.</p> <p>6734. Regarding minute 6714, the Harley group organising the bonfire have issued a poster advertising the event which erroneously states that the parish council has banned the fireworks. The matter was raised with the group and no further communication mentioning the parish council is to be issued without prior approval. It was noted that there were fireworks at the event.</p> <p>6735. The Harley Activity Group have been asked to confirm the date of the Harley Gala, the committee has responded that it is not certain that there will be one in 2025, due to a lack of organisers.</p>

Councillor Knight reported that some of the parish council grit bins have previously been removed by the Estate.
